



Here is a fun oven mitt tutorial! I've been wanting to make a couple of these for my kitchen. So when I received my fat quarters of Delighted from Amanda Herring, I jumped at the chance to make this!!

Supplies:

5 fat quarters (or scraps!! At least 3" square)
Cotton batting
Insul-Brite (batting with heat resistance!)
Muslin or lining fabric
Freezer paper
Optional: rick rack!

Let's Cook!!



Cut at least 60 5" squares. If you are using 5 fat quarters, cut 12 of each!! (that's so you don't have to do the math!! LOL!!)

We are going to sew them together randomly, so don't worry about the quilt police! You'll do fine!

Sew the blocks in 5 rows of 6 each. (You will do this step twice).

Sew the rows together matching the seams and pinning! (I've become a firm believer in pinning!! Yay!!)



For the template, there are several options. What I did was I took freezer paper and traced around my hand and arm leaving a good two to three inches around for the seams. I will say that there are many templates on the internet, too. It's up to you!

Cut out your template and iron it onto your blocks. Layer your pieces like this: Blocks

Insul-Brite
Batting
Muslin
Muslin
Batting
Insul-Brite
Blocks (wrong side up!)

If you layer them correctly, you will have the mirror image you need for both sides. Cut them all out! Yay!!



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Time to quilt these babies!! I used these wonder clips my mom gave me for my birthday. You can pin baste or spray baste if you like. I started in the middle and just sewed diagonal lines in one direction on both sides.



When you are done quilting, sew a zigzag stitch around the whole piece.



Be sure and trim off excess fabric!

When you are done quilting both sides, place both sides right sides together and pin. Here is where you add your little piece of rick rack if you want a little hanger. You can use a little piece of fabric, too, if you want! ☺



Isn't this darling so far???



Sew the two sides together from the bottom only to the mid-top. HINT: make sure you are inside the zigzagging, otherwise it will show on the outside! ☺ You want to leave the other side unsewn so you can put your binding on the cuff.

To make your own bias binding (which is what I did!), take one of your leftover fat quarter fabric and cut a piece diagonally. Then cut a 1 1/2" strip from that diagonal cut. This is the stretchable side of the fabric. You need that...trust me!

Take your strip and place one raw edge right sides together with your cuff of your mitt. Pin.



Manipulate the bias binding to fit the cuff! Sew it on there!



Fold the other raw edge in and press.



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Fold it over your raw edges and machine sew it down. I used those cool wonder clips again to hold it just in the right place! Cool!!



I also folded the ends into themselves before I sewed it down. Then you will want to finish sewing the whole two pieces together! Yay!!



side out! Make sure you have clipped the part inside the thumb right up to the seam to make it easier to turn.

Time to turn it right



And you have yourself an oven mitt!! Yay!!!
