

# Quick and Easy Scalloped Delighted Apron

Here is a quick apron tutorial that you can whip up in no time at all using only fat quarters!! Love that!!

## Supplies:

5 fat quarters (I used Amanda Herring's Delighted line! Perfect for a fun vintage apron!!)

Cardstock for a template

Optional: coordinating velvet trim and crocheted flowers

## Let's sew:

1. Cut three of your fat quarters into three 4" strips each. Depending if you want a long apron or a short one, you can cut these either way; 21" length or 18" length. I did the 21" length.
2. Sew your first three fat quarter strips together longways, creating a big rectangle of fabric.
3. Cut your waistline fabric into three 4" strips, too.
4. Sew your three strips together at the ends of each strip, creating one long strip. Find the middle of the long strip, finger press or pin it! Find the middle of the skirt part; finger press or pin. Matching the raw edges and the middles, right sides together, pin the waistband to the top of the skirt. Sew using a 1/4in seam.
5. Press a ¼ piece of the other raw edge of the waistband. Fold the waistband strip over the raw edges and press so that the top is even. Press a ¼ fold on each side of the part of the ties that haven't been pressed. Matching the folded and pressed edges, sew all around the waistband, creating a top stitching on the waistband. If it's a little uneven, don't worry...we will cover it.
6. Create your scallops by drawing a little scallop on a piece of cardstock. Cut out two pieces per scallop from your last fat quarter for a total of 20 scallops. Sew each scallop right sides together leaving the bottom (or really the top in this case) open for turning. Clip curves!
7. Turn the scallops right side out and press flat. Place them at the bottom of your skirt matching raw edges. Pin, pin, pin!! Sew the scallops to the bottom, turn them down and top stitch at 1/8".
8. Place your velvet ribbon over your waistband seam. Using matching thread, sew it down. Add a flower here and there. You can add a pocket, too, if you want!
